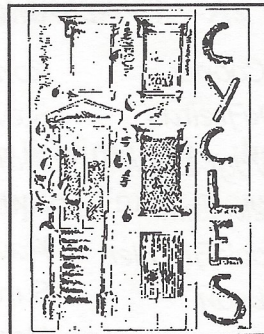

From a brilliant seed, City-As-School has blossomed in New York City to four boroughs offering exciting learning to thousands of creative, intelligent and socially conscious students, parents and staff. During my years as Principal, we opened the Bronx site, created the Multicultural Department and expanded our offerings to students with special needs. 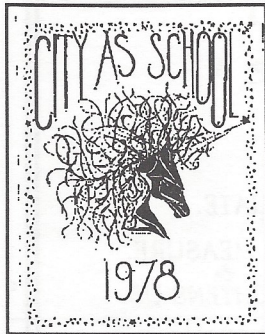

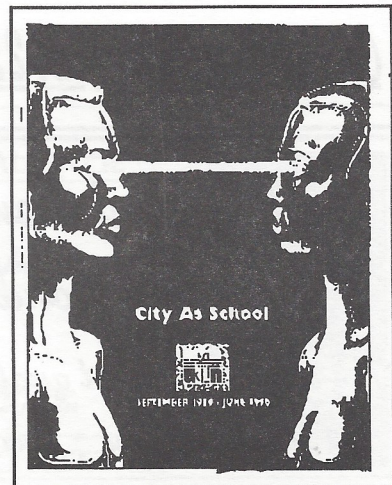

Dear City As folks:

Glad to hear from you. My time at City-As definitely did influence me in a positive way, and I'd like to return the favor by relating my experiences. I came to City As School in the fall of 1989, during my junior year of high school. An average day during my last year at Hunter consisted of a stroll around the city, or, perhaps, a rendezvous in Tompkins Square Park. At some point, a friend mentioned City As to me. She had been attending the school for a year, and after asking around, I found that the school had quite a reputation amongst the activist youth that I was hanging out with.

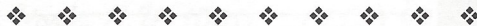


I applied over the summer and entered in September of 1989. During my two years at the school, I interned at political offices such as the War Resister's League and Transportation Alternatives. I learned photography at the Museum of Natural History and photo retouching at a small shop. I took college level classes at the New School for Social Research. I wasn't, of course, a model of responsibility. I would still take the occasional day off, and there were internships where my performance was abysmal. I was a teenager, and a rebellious one at that. Even the best of high schools wasn't going to change that. The important thing is that I learned quite a bit while at City As. Practical skills, like how to work at an office and retouch a photograph, and less tangible skills, like how to set flexible goals while still planning for the future. When I left City As I was in a far better place than I had been upon entering.



And, even as I sit here an unemployed twenty three year old with little idea as to the city I'll be in next month, let alone the career I'll be pursuing, I can look back at my time at City As and know that it added to my development in a truly positive way. I know now that it's all right to change goals midstream, that it's all right to reevaluate your progress every now and then, and to change direction if that's what's necessary. I only spent two years at City As, but they were fundamental ones, coming at an important time for me. Regardless of where I'm at ten years down the road, I know that I'll be successful in my own personal way. And, because of what I learned at City As, I know I'll be happy.
